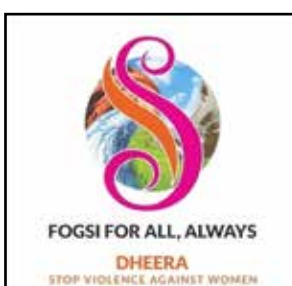
**My dear Friend FOGSIans,**

During unprecedented Covid Pandemic, which has restricted our physical Conferences CMEs and Workshops and we have adapted to the new Normal the Virtual platform to reach out to our members and the women of our Country and we have connected with each other by organizing physical conference also later on.



## FOGSI FOR ALL – FOGSI FOR EVERY FOGSIAN:

This will strive for the girl to become Sahasi with Swacchta. Samruddhi, Swasthya to be Surakshit with Shakti to reach her full potential as a woman. A healthy environment is the core of the health of a woman. A healthy woman makes a happy family and a strong nation.

During my tenure we have done various educative and awareness programs for the health of #women of our country. We have organized on regional/ zonal/ national workshops, CMEs, screening camps for cancer cervix, Hb, BMD, training programs, certification courses on various topics including partograms, labour management protocols & guidelines, prematurity, hypertensive disorders of pregnancy, caesarean sections, PPH, anemia eradication, PCOS, hyperprolactinemia, endometriosis, infertility, menopause, premature ovarian insufficiency, and menopause. Therapeutics include Progesterone, Calcium, Vit D, Folic acid, Contraceptives, Norethisterone and Dienogest and have given an update in all subjects of obstetrics & gynaecology including community awareness programs.

### My flag ship programme - DHEERA SAY NO TO VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN (VAW)

When I became the member of FIGO working group on “No to Violence Against Women” in 2015. I launched DHEERA Campaign – No to VAW in FOGSI FRC Congress in 2016 and continuing till date.

**DHEERA - Our work on ‘Say NO to VAW’ has been based largely on 3 strong societal pillars, which have become the cornerstone of our activities.**

1. **Online School Certification Program** - is my flagship program as President FOGSI with UNICEF India for students from grades 9<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup>. The program took off on a large scale. We have trained 2000 master trainers across our Fogsians and 5000 teachers. We covered around 3700 schools and 237000 students across our country. Our goal was to catch them young and they grow up to be more gender-neutral citizens of our country.
2. **Workshops / CMEs for ObGyns** to build awareness & capacity. Under this humongous initiative, we have run multiple workshops across different issues.

**Intensive Community-level Work and Awareness Raising Campaigns** Over the course of the last few years, I have ensured that the platform of FOGSI was utilized to further important causes and aid the betterment of various vulnerable segments of the society. Be it mother and child health, nutrition, vaccination, addressing major health issues like Cervical Cancer Mukth Bharath, and Save The Environment’ as it has an impact on women’s health,

**In 2021, I was nominated by FOGSI to the post of Honorary Treasurer of FIGO.** I was elected unopposed as the Honorary Treasurer of FIGO with support from international friends across the FLASOG, RCOG, EBCOG, ACOG, AFOG, and AFOG and which made me Director of FIGO trading and the Chair of the FIGO Publications Management Board (PMB). My vision is to make FOGSI stronger academically globally and to connect with all societies to be able to partner with them to campaign for NO to VAW which will go a long way to make women healthier, reduce the Maternal Mortality and Morbidity, and will indirectly help the economies of the nations



In collaboration with International bodies, we were conducted many CME’s, Workshops, DHEERA and Public health programs and exchanging our thoughts and ideas regarding PPH, Respectful abortion care, Respectful maternity care, Menstrual hygiene and Sexual and reproductive health of women.

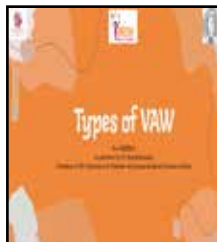

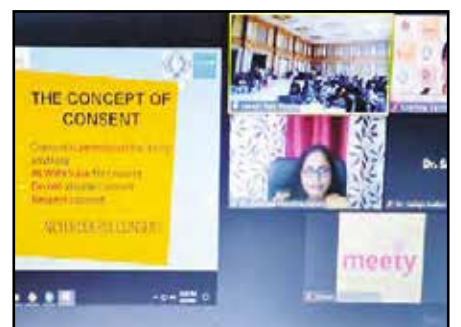

**Respectful Abortion Care (RAC)** – This is an essential care that should be accessible, available & affordable to all the women in India who want to have the contraceptive and abortion services. It's a Joint FOGSI President and WHO Flagship Initiative 2021-2022 with webinars conducted across four zones of FOGSI for dissemination of MTP Amendment 2021 and to Help protect the Sexual and Reproductive Rights of Women. This project has won appreciation from many global OBGn societies who have been motivated to do this in their countries.



**SWA – RAKSHA is Suraksha – IKSHANA - FOGSI CARES FOR THE CARERS**

All the front liners have done noble work, the cost of their health and their families. As a small token of our appreciation to their hard work and the sacrifices made, we Team FOGSI 2021-2022 have designed a program to take care of the health of all health care workers. \*Screening for NCDs and cancer screening across all the societies by FOGSIANS at individual, societal and as pre-congress workshops. \***Together we say “We Care for You**



**Cervical Cancer Prevention** Strategies by FOGSI in collaboration with FIGO FOGSI Strives for Elimination of Cervical Cancer by 2030, and HPV Vaccination of 90% girls between 9-14 years. Screening of 70% women twice in a lifetime at 35 & 45 by primary HPV testing by self-sampling/physician sampling and treatment of 90% of precancerous lesions. We plan Public Awareness sessions on HPV vaccination & screening, breast cancer & endometrial cancer screening.

**Anemia Mukth Bharat:** This is the dream of the country yet to be realized. Despite the high intensity focus from Government and FOGSI, the incidence of Anemia in pregnant women is still 50.4% and a major contributor to MMR and Near Miss. We are planning a dedicated year long campaign involving every platform, media for community connect





**Breast Feeding Awareness week, August 1st to 7<sup>th</sup>.**

In our Country only 25% of new-borns are put to the breast within one hour of birth and only 46% are exclusively breastfed. Appropriate feeding practices are the key contributor to reducing morbidities and mortalities in babies. The myths, misconceptions, taboos and the stigma also need to be addressed so also a campaign to make all public places breast feeding friendly.

**OGSI Poshan Abhiyaan 2021:** a major focus this year will be on nutrition in collaboration with UNICEF & NIN Hyderabad. 25% of our women are undernourished and give birth to low birth weight babies, perpetuating an intergenerational cycle of undernutrition. Macro & micronutrient deficiencies in women can also cause noncommunicable diseases.

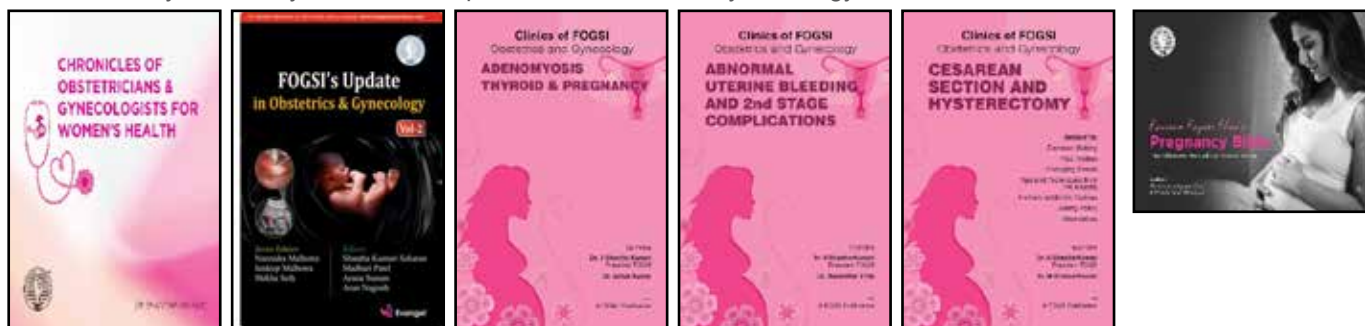

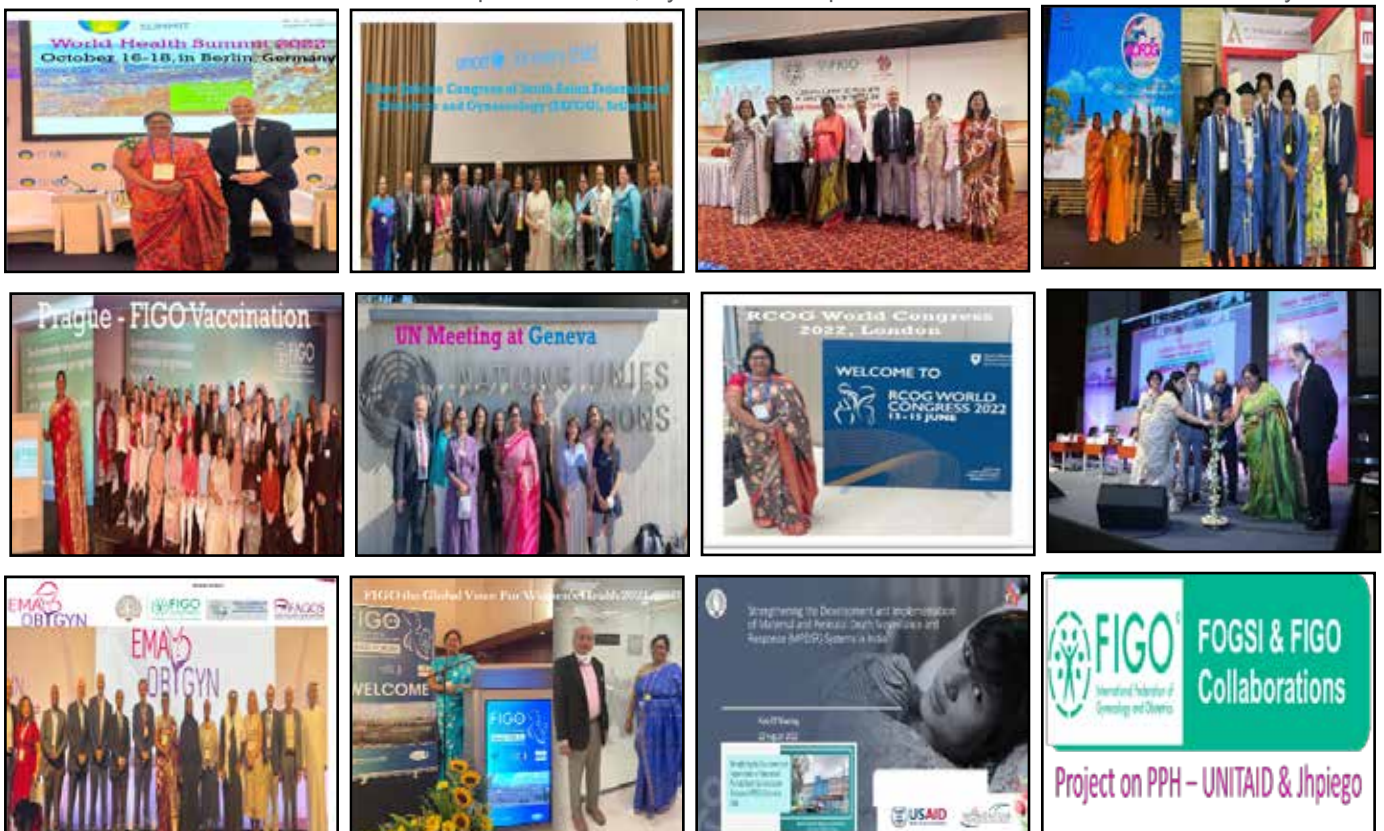

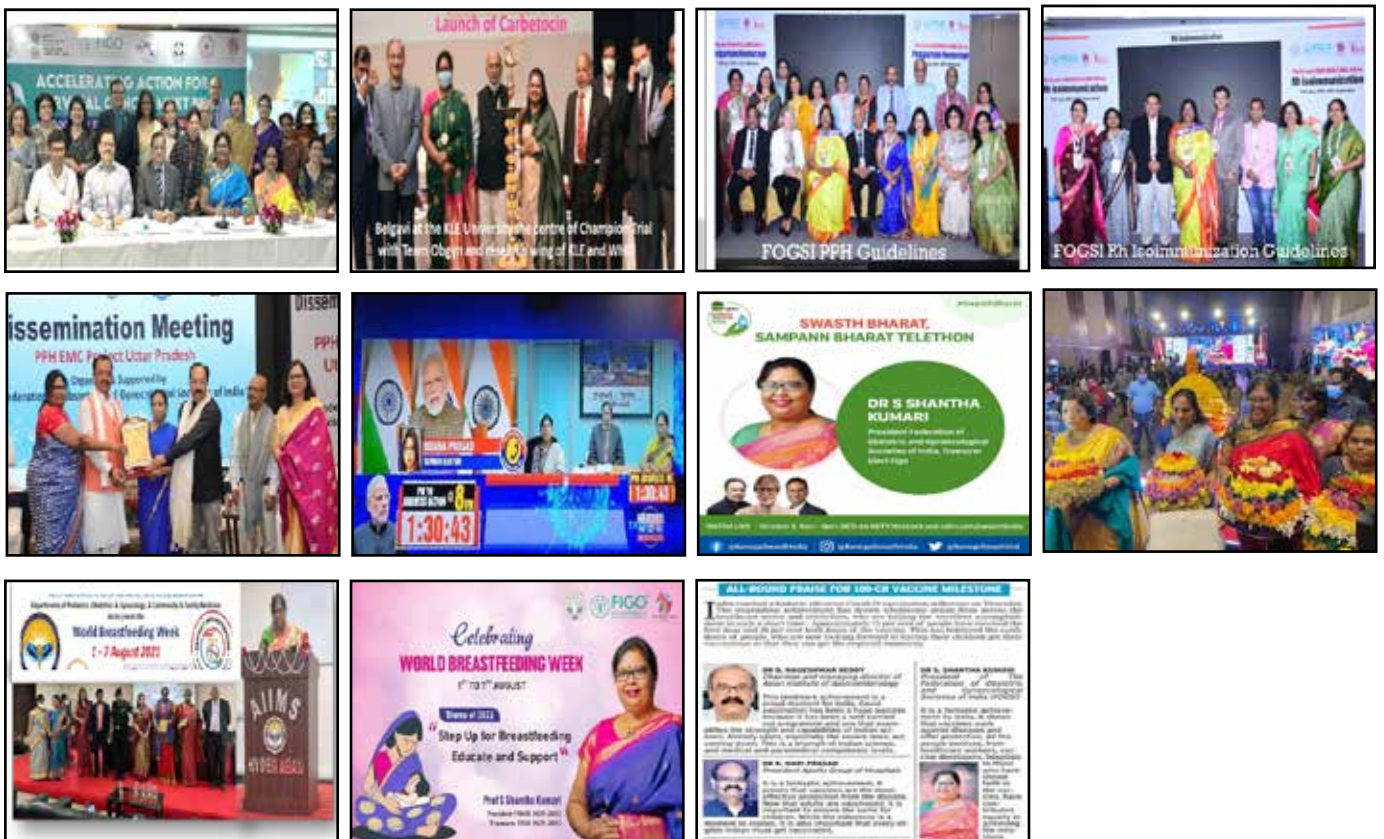

FOGSI professional indemnity Policy is with ICICI LOMBARD, and we have partnered with Cover You as a third party. The FOGSI professional indemnity scheme with CoverYou began in June 2020. So far, we have 4367 members, 2709 members who have renewed their scheme.

#### FOGSI SSS : Dec 2022

The SSS member's nominee receives a fund on the demise of SSS member. This time with the request from the members, we have increased the DFC amount from Rs.100/- to Rs.300/- which will give substantial amount to nominee. We have started QR code for online payments. Members are encouraged to use them for quick payment. "Members who are not SSS members should become member as early as possible".

Total members upto December 2022 – 1632.

#### SMS :

SMS messages are extremely effective to remain in touch with each other. Permission is required from Telecom Regulatory Authority of India before sending bulk SMS. This process of permission may take about 24 to 48 hours.

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**Social Media :**

#### **The office:**

We have developed an online social security scheme enrolment app and we have given a link to this app on the website. Last year we have introduced FOGSI App on Android and IOS, Social Security scheme online enrolment app and Accounts App, WhatsApp group account "8976735079"

#### **Network upgradation in office:**

Network upgradation in office has been done and we have switched over from TATA to JIO for better speed. Earlier we

were having of TATA communications with 8 MBPS internet. Now we have upgraded to JIO -50 MBPS speed. So we can actually conducting hybrid conferences from office. We have Access points in office for a wired network. Our second-floor premises also renovated and they are under cc tv surveillance. We have installed wifi router and internet on second floor. We also have a virtual platform for 500 participants. We are organising this without pharma or any technical support. So far more than 130 meetings have been hosted on this virtual platform.

#### Report from 1st April 2022 to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2022:

During this period we have had an overall income of Rs. 2,24,89,377/- and a reasonable expense of Rs. 2,21,65,164/- so we were in good shape and we have a surplus of Rs.3,24,212/- in December 2022. Presidential funds raised during this period were Rs. 37,46,000/-out of this Rs. 28,73,742/- were used for object of the fund so the balance of Presidential fund of Rs. 8,72,257/- as on 31 December 2022.

I request all the societies and organizing committees to regularly submit audited reports (within 9 months conference) to center for smooth auditing of center accounts.

Manyata is FOGSI's flagship initiative in partnership with MSD for Mothers, MacArthur Foundation and Jhpiego for

private sector providers which was formally inaugurated in 2017, after the sign up in 2013 for phase one by Dr Hema Divakar, 2013 President of FOGSI. FOGSI has customized safe delivery standards in alignment with WHO standards and Govt of India standards, for the private maternity care providers in India. Led by FOGSI, the program harnesses the power of a professional society not only to scale but also self-regulate.

National Program Management Unit which was earlier funded by MacArthur Foundation, under FOGSI, manages the program operations, including sensitization, enrolment and co ordination for assessment visits to conduct quality assurance, which includes trainings for lead assessors, who are deputed to carry out external assessments for certification independently and issue Manyata certification.

#### AN EVER-GROWING MANYATA COMMUNITY

Manyata scale up in newer geographies in 2022-23:

FOGSI-NPMU facilitated registration of over 2200+ private maternity facilities across 23 states in India including Maharashtra, Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand, Haryana, Delhi, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Rajasthan, Assam, Manipur, Punjab, Uttarakhand, Bihar, Madhya Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Telangana, Orissa, Gujarat, West Bengal, Chhattisgarh, Goa, Andhra Pradesh, and Meghalaya. Of these a total of about 1500+ facilities have already received their Manyata certification.

#### Manyata Quality Improvement (QI) and Quality Assurance (QA)

FOGSI-NPMU coordinated 725+ quality assurance assessments through virtual platforms. Of this 550 were assessed under the Manyata program while the rest 175 were assessed as per LaQshya-Manyata standards. Quality Improvement trainings are currently ongoing for 450+ facilities which will be Manyata certified within the next year.

A total of about 450+ facilities will be Manyata certified in the upcoming year 2023-2024.

Keeping the Indian Prime Minister's 'Aspirational Districts Program' as a priority intervention, Manyata has already expanded its presence in many aspirational districts across 23 implementation states. Manyata follows the global principle of Quality, Equity and Dignity (QED). More states are primed to join the program in the near future!



## MANYATA'S CENTRE FOR SKILL ENHANCEMENTS (CSEs)

12 CSEs ( Navi Mumbai Obstetrics and Gynecological Society office in Navi Mumbai, Dr Gupte's CSE in Pune, Dr Hema Divakar's CSE in Bangalore, Dr Sadhana Gupta in Gorakhpur, Dr Shembhekar in Nagpur, La Femme in New Delhi under Dr Hrishikesh Pai, HLFPT and GE as an independent CSE, Rajasthan CSE under Dr Lila Vyas, Dr Alka Pandey in Bihar, Dr Chandrawati's CSE in Lucknow and Dr Jaideep Malhotra's CSE at Rainbow hospital in Agra were developed in 2022-2023 for conducting trainings for doctors and staff on Manyata standards, skill drills.

## MANYATA GOES DIGITAL

Providers can login with their credentials, explore the dashboard and stay clued in to all the developments regarding Manyata.

**Project ECHO**, a digital blended learning platform, aims to optimize healthcare delivery in India by addressing the challenge of knowledge transfer in the healthcare sector. Integrating technology with the healthcare system, makes it more accessible, robust and dynamic. Project ECHO sessions. CSEs are dedicated training management centers under Manyata. These centers conduct trainings for doctors and staff on Manyata standards, skill drills.

Quality assurance component in Manyata in getting streamlined with the help of a digital tool jointly prepared by FOGSI and **PharmAccess** with technical assistance from FOGSI NPMU and is in the process of managing end to end Manyata assessments.

## CMEs AND SENSITIZATION SESSIONS FOR PROVIDERS AND TRAININGS

Lead Assessors trainings were held virtually by NPMU and PA teams apprising 50 assessors on Manyata assessment methodology and the digital tool. Many onboarding and training sessions conducted by FOGSI-NPMU team for the newly joined hospitals in Mumbai.

## LAQSHYA-MANYATA – A JOINT INITIATIVE BY GOVERNMENT OF MAHARASHTRA AND FOGSI – yet another major milestone

In 2019, Manyata achieved an important milestone in its pursuit to benchmark quality care for private providers in India. The Public Health Department, Government of Maharashtra has partnered with FOGSI to launch 'LaQshya-Manyata', a quality improvement and certification program for private maternity care facilities, to be rolled out in every district and Municipal Corporation of the state. LaQshya-Manyata was officially launched amid fanfare on September 8, 2019 in Pune, by Shri Eknath Shinde, former Hon'ble Minister for Health, Maharashtra, and Dr Nandita Palshetkar, President, FOGSI. In attendance were prominent state government officials, FOGSI-NPMU National Convenor Dr Hema Divakar, FOGSI leadership, and MSD for Mothers.

In line with the above, FOGSI-NPMU coordinated LaQshya-

Manyata quality assurance virtually for 176 facilities in 2022-23. Quality Improvement is ongoing for 210+ facilities which will receive certification within the next year. By the end of 2023, a total of 350+ facilities will be LaQshya-Manyata certified.

An annual LaQshya-Manyata Technical Committee Meeting was duly organised on 24th March and 13th December in 2022.

## End-to-end Manyata Registration and QA Management with certification including financials and Manyata database and Assessor Management:

The NPMU team was responsible for end-to-end registration and QA management, including maintaining the Manyata registration database, organising financials, undertaking QA along with scoring, and managing all the assessors associated with the program.

Of the 216 FOGSI-Manyata assessors, more than 60% have completed at least one Manyata assessment.

Around 2200+ active registrations are completed and of these 1500+ facilities have taken up assessments.

## Manyata Quality surveillance in the implementing states:

FOGSI-NPMU oversaw the registration of 130+ facilities for quality surveillance. A total of 130 facilities were recertified. (The Manyata certification for these facilities had expired and they were eligible for recertification)

## PharmAccess Collaboration with FOGSI-NPMU to train FOGSI lead assessors on digital QA tool:

A total of 50 FOGSI lead assessors and 9 NABH assessors were oriented by PharmAccess Foundation on their digital tool for QA and initiated utilizing the tool in 2022-23.

## FOGSI-NABH Collaboration for third party neutral assessments:

A total of 160+ Manyata assessments have been carried out by NABH this year with NPMU's support.

As per the MoU, 9 NABH assessors were trained on the Manyata initiative, standards and assessment methodology and empaneled as FOGSI-Manyata assessors and 6 FOGSI-Manyata assessors were also trained as NABH Entry level assessors in Delhi in April 2023.

## FOGSI FIGO Leadership Development Initiative (LDI)

FOGSI has been selected by FIGO to implement the Leadership Development Initiative (LDI) project for improving maternal and newborn health outcomes through clinical program interventions and advocacy in India.

The LDI project funded by The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation is also being implemented in five other countries (Bangladesh, Ethiopia, Kenya, Nigeria and Pakistan).

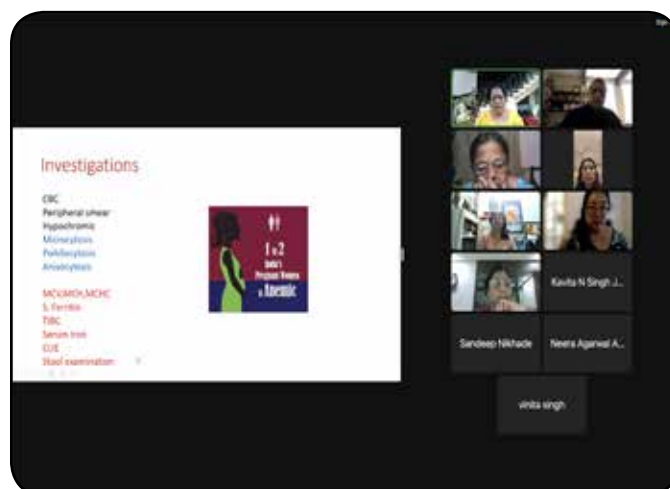
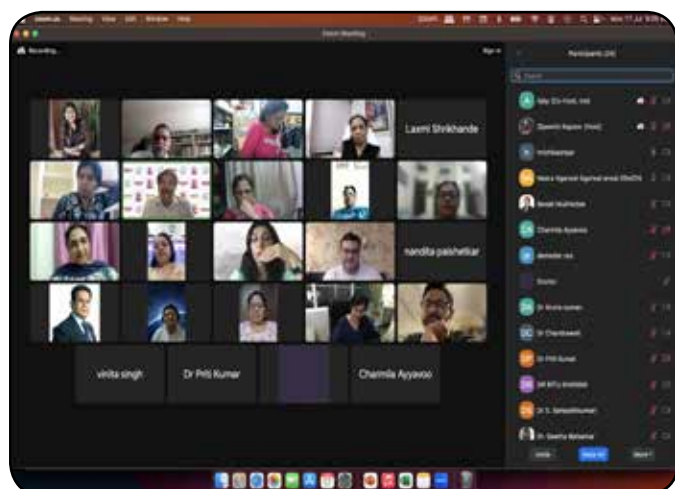
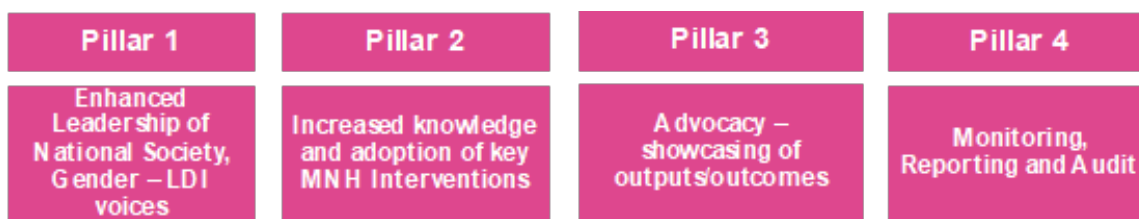

LDI project goal is to improve maternal and newborn health outcomes and it has 4 primary aims - 1) Strengthening Leadership skills, 2) Increase adoption of maternal and newborn interventions, 3) Addressing potential barriers to

coverage 4) Building a Gender-transformative approach to champion women in leadership. The initiative is more than a training-based approach, focusing on coherent national strategies including health systems strengthening, network integration and local data collection for problem solving. LDI will enable member societies to address the many competing priorities needed to improve women's health and well-being. Empowering the leaders will be done through tailored leadership workshops - skills including, but not limited to, the areas of program, organizational management (financial, grants), advocacy, gender, youth, accountability, women-centered care will be imparted.

LDI will focus on the use of hematinic agents for anaemia (IV iron) and managing postpartum haemorrhage (EMOTIVE trial).

FOGSI leadership teams' strategic approach to meet the LDI goal and aims is based on 4 pillars.



# PROGRESS REPORT HPV VACCINE PROJECT

## INTRODUCTION:

The Federation of Obstetric and Gynaecological Societies of India (FOGSI) is the professional organization representing practitioners of obstetrics and gynecology in India. With **270** member societies and over **42,000++** individual members spread over the length and breadth of the country, FOGSI is probably one of the largest membership based organizations of specialized professionals.

FOGSI exists to encourage and disseminate knowledge, education and research in the field of obstetrics and gynecology, to pilot and promote preventive and therapeutic services related to the practice of obstetrics and gynecology for betterment of the health of women and children in particular and the wellbeing of the community in general, to advocate the cause of reproductive health and rights and to support and protect the interest of practitioners of obstetrics and gynecology in India.

In order to further operationalize its perspective and commitment to Women's Health, FOGSI and IAP collaborated with American Cancer Society and Cancer Foundation of India to create a pool of 20000 and more trained OBGYNs and Pediatricians in order to support the Government's initiative of vaccinating children between the age group of 9 to 14 years. A message flows through groups of OBYGYNs to motivate people to become the Pioneers in the History of Medical profession by becoming a catalyst in setting up a path and a long journey to a mammoth task of creating awareness and vaccinating India's girl child for HPV vaccination to eliminate cervical cancer, by becoming a part of the first ever **Training of trainers –HPV Vaccination Programme**.



## D) PROCESS:

### 1) Meeting with Zonal Leaders: Zoom Meeting with Zonal leaders on 13<sup>th</sup> July.

Intake of lists from Zonal for Master Trainers. Individual calls were made to 180 people. Mails were sent to everyone for the announcement of the Programme. The target was to recruit **125 Master Trainers who will then each train 100 trainees making it to more than 10000 “Champions”**. The pattern and flow was discussed at length. A need for physical TOT meeting apart from the digital meeting of the MT was discussed and finalized on 28<sup>th</sup> OCTOBER at Thane during the National Oncology conference. The coordination, planning and timely execution with the help of Zonal leaders is consistent till date.

**2) Meetings with ACS / CFI:** Both the organizations have acted as the Mother organizations for lending timely feedback and source of encouragement, enthusiasm, knowledge and support to FOGSI throughout. **FUND OF 25 LAKHS** has been sanctioned by ACS/CFI with release in phasic manner

**3) The Master Trainers:** The Trainers have been recruited representing 20 approx States of India from all zones of FOGSIANS only. Announcement of the TOT was made through Whatsapp groups, mails and through its good offices. We received a tremendous response for the same. The only condition was each trainer would give list of 100 members to be trained list to the Project. We received 180 interested master trainers eager to enroll themselves for the programme out of which 135 master trainers are finalized who committed themselves for submission of list. Entire August month went into receiving data now member data cleaned and kept ready to send to Master Trainers.

All the MT were given a choice to choose for a physical training programme where Digital training been mandatory for each master trainer. Each MT was sent selection invite and confirmed participation for the same. Several mails were sent for announcement of the programme. Further, these clinicians will disseminate the knowledge to the community. A group of 139 MT have been formed for day to day communication.

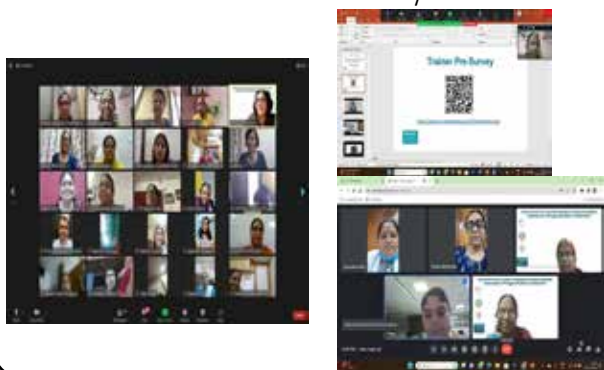

### 5) Digital Trainings:

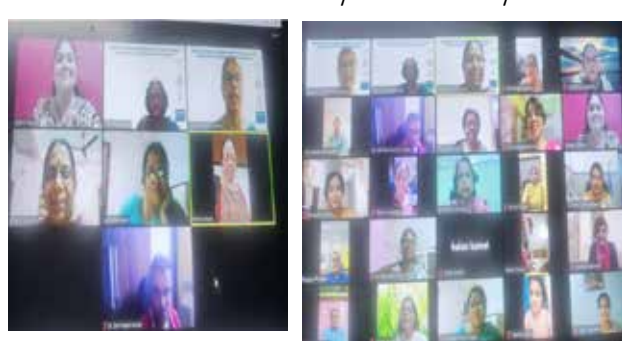

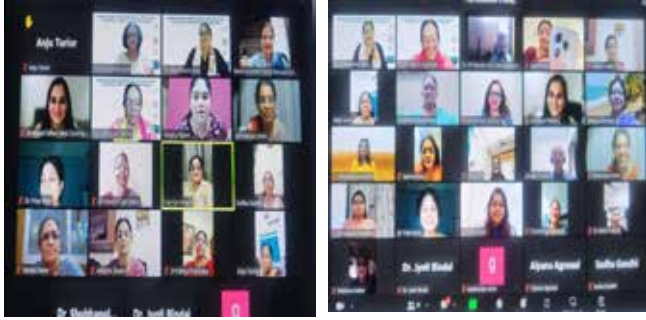

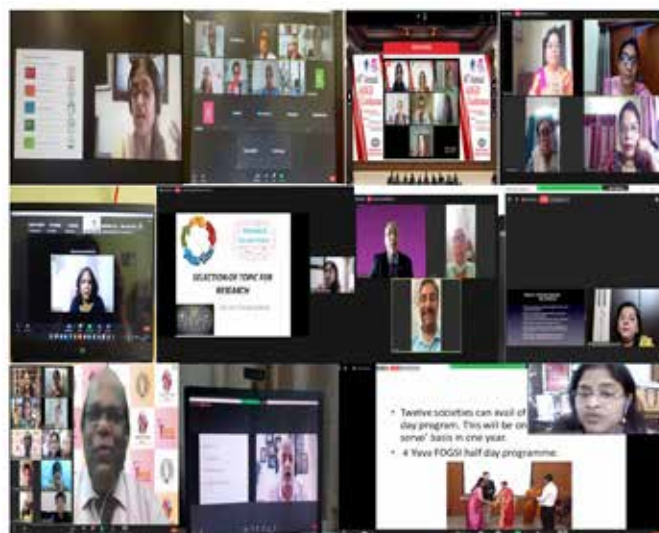
